

The Sanctuary Evergreens

Evergreen boughs, sometimes strung along banisters or door frames, sometimes wrapped in circles to form wreaths, sometimes bunched together in swags and hung: in northern Europe they have long served as symbols of that which lasts, in season and out.

Evergreen trees are always intact, always lush, always scented, always waiting for new growth to join their branches in the spring.

No matter what shape, wreath, swag, sprig or tree -all different, and all the same: testaments to the unending love of God, and the life abundant we share through Jesus Christ.

Winter - in our world, in our lives - is real, and takes its toll. Whatever season it was in Bethlehem that night, we know the love of God does not flee from the cold.

The life and love of God in Jesus Christ has known many winters, and grace persists like the needles of a pine tree.

The Advent Colors

Dark blue is the color of Advent, a color that symbolizes hope: think of the night sky before the dawn breaks.

In the darkness of this color we wait and watch for the light of Christ.

The deep blue of the night sky also is scattered with stars, by which humans have navigated since before time began.

The star of Bethlehem still calls the wise to kneel by the manger.

The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath, which is often decorated with a circle of evergreen boughs, reminds us of God's never ending and never failing love for us. It is a tradition begun in Scandinavian homes, eventually baptized for use in the church.

The circle never ends, and the light only grows.

While sometimes colors have been assigned with particular virtues or values, ultimately the symbol is about the accumulation of light against the darkening season.

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness will not overcome it.

Isaiah 9:2, 6

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named

Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
